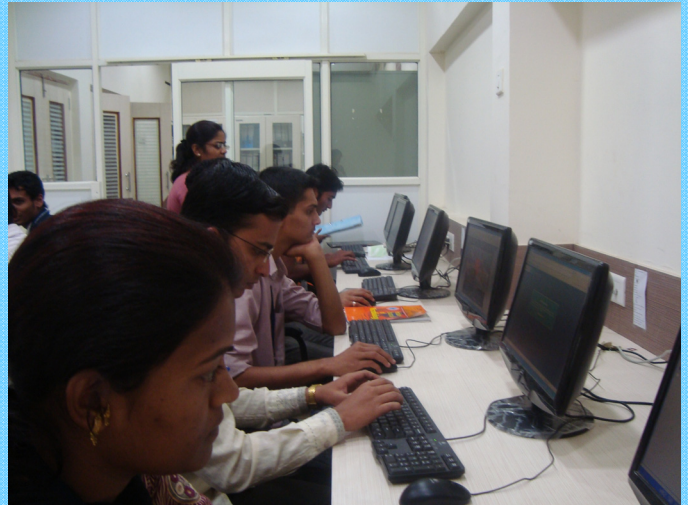

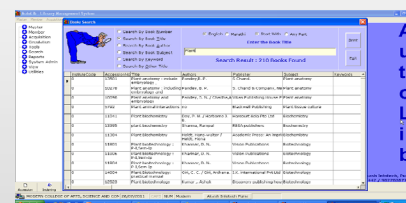

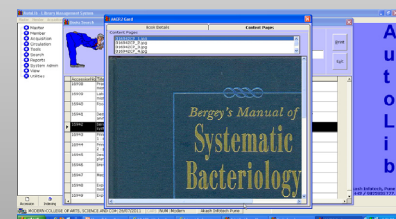
Library Automation

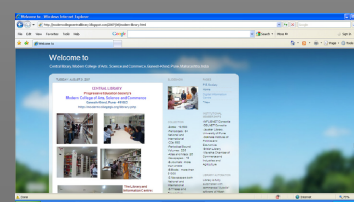
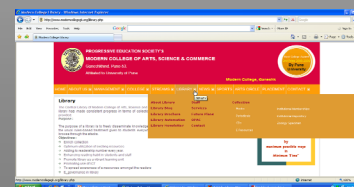

Plagiarism

According to the Merriam-Webster Online Dictionary "plagiarize" means

- to steal and pass off (the ideas or words of another) as one's own
- to use (another's production) without crediting the source
- to commit literary theft

All of the following are considered plagiarism:

- turning in someone else's work as your own
- copying words or ideas from someone else without giving credit
- failing to put a quotation in quotation marks
- giving incorrect information about the source of a quotation
- changing words but copying the sentence structure of a source without giving credit
- copying so many words or idea from a source that it makes up the majority of your work, whether you give credit or not

Most cases of plagiarism can be avoided, however, by citing sources. Simply acknowledging that certain material has been borrowed, and providing your audience with the information necessary to find that source, is usually enough to prevent plagiarism.

Tips on Searching Information online

- To find definitions type " what is ...?" e.g. "what is embedded system?"
- Place plus sign (+) in front of search terms to specify must include the term.
e.g. +diagnose
- And minus sign (-) in front of search term to specify must exclude term
- Try using quotes (" ") around search term or phrase e.g."knowledge management"
- Use * to specify stem search (truncation)
- If you are not sure about spelling use ~ .e.g. "chakraborty"
- If you don't know URL exactly use inurl: e.g. inurl:"moderncollege"
- Use Boolean AND for searching for all keywords or Boolean OR (|) for searching any keywords. E.g. ethics OR "values" OR teachings

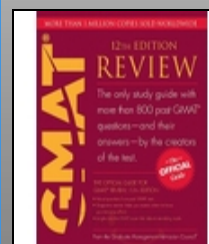

Use of Web Resources in Social Sciences for Teachers and Students

1995 was a landmark year for computer users in Pune. The World Wide Web was a beckoning call to all. PN 1 and PN2 of VSNL were the only Internet gateways available for retail users. Luckily for me I was a computer user from 1991 and working in an International Research Organization in 1995. All of us who were Researchers got hands - on training in the use of Internet and ever since the sheer volume of Web Resources in Social Sciences does not cease to amaze me.

For both, students and teachers of Social Sciences , it is imperative to understand the levels and applications of web resources in study and research.

We can start with Wikipedia (www.wikipedia.com) which is a compilation of basic data on a topic. The next level is to go to specific websites and web portals.

There is a range of websites that are useful. For e.g. in Psychology we can refer to www.apa.org, (the official website of the American psychological association) www.naopindia.net (the official website of the National Academy of Psychology) . These websites give information, data and also include the online journals brought out by these organizations. Similarly other Social sciences have websites related to their national and international organizations. One such source of data and information is www.epw.org.in . (Economic and Political Weekly)

Statistics on various issues (health, education, child labour, etc) , policy documents, government related data can b obtained from www.nicnet.in and www.nic.in .This website is a reliable source of data from National Informatics Centre , which was set up for information dissemination regarding the functioning of Government departments.

Most of the Social Sciences have a practice of bringing out a monthly publication of International Abstracts e.g. Psychology Abstracts, Sociology Abstracts, Economics Abstracts etc. These are compilations of all the internationally published research in abstract form. This is something every research student has to refer. (American Psychology Association publishes the Psychology abstracts in print and e format)

Besides this, publishers like Sage, Springer and Pearson have their own websites with archival sections (www.sagepub.in, www.pearson.com, www.pearsoned.co.in, www.springer.com)

Various e journals allow access to full texts , some of them are www.esocialsciences.com, www.infochangeindia.org (news and analysis on developmental and social issues in India). www.ssrc.org/blog is a special web log edited by Social Science experts. List serves related to Social sciences allow a user to join several discussion fora for interactive discussions with subject experts.

Social networking websites also have an informative and archival component that provides data and leads on various subjects.

The list and variety of web resources is endless. The only hitch is checking the information for authenticity and finding authorial content! (as opposed to the cut paste variety) This requires skill, training and exposure , beyond merely 'Googling' a term!

Exploration of Web-based Resources by Science Students and Research Scholars

Scientific research is touching new heights every day rather every moment, one should say. Everyday hundreds of research-articles are being published from different conventional as well as interdisciplinary scientific streams, both in the form of hard copies and online versions. With time, the scenario for scientific referencing has changed and use of internet based or web-based resources have become almost inevitable for the whole scientific research community. If one has to keep pace with the global developments and updations in scientific research, then he/she has to explore the web-based resources at the maximum. However, students or research scholars should use the authentic websites for information and resources.

Importance of web-based resources can be realized from the fact that world's all major scientific publishers the world over, now a days publish their research articles *online, way ahead of their hard copies*. A huge collection of scientific information is available on various websites, which can easily be accessed and may prove to be highly beneficial for the science students both at under/post-graduate levels and for their doctoral research programs.

Beginners can start with exploring the well-known search engines and web-portals such as Google (www.google.com), Yahoo (www.yahoo.com), Wikipedia (www.wikipedia.com) and a more science specific web-site- Science-gateway (www.sciencegateway.org) etc.

In addition, web-based resources can also help to encourage the students to know about the great researchers who contributed tremendously through their breakthrough findings, and became Nobel laureates. Students can avail this information very easily just by clicking on www.nobelprize.org. They can find all the details about the past laureates' lives, their research areas and major findings, and of-course their Nobel Lectures (the lectures delivered at the time of receiving the prize) of such great personalities. This information will give a great impetus to our future scientists.

As far as the Indian scenario is concerned, science students and scholars can easily find the information about all the three pioneer scientific societies of the nation viz. Indian Science Congress Association (www.sciencecongress.nic.in), Indian National Science Association (INSA: www.insa.ac.in) and Indian Academy of Sciences (www.ias.ac.in) by exploring their respective websites given here.

Moreover, students can also avail the information available on www.niscair.res.in (National Institute of Science Communication and Information Resources, New Delhi), which is a pioneer institute working towards making all information-resources on current and traditional knowledge systems in science and technology in the country, available to scientific community, and to promote communication in science to diverse constituents at all levels.

Students can easily access a number of scientific Indian journals covering diverse scientific fields such as Current Science (<http://www.ias.ac.in/currsci/>), a well-established peer-reviewed scientific journal published by the Indian Academy of Sciences, Bangalore every fortnight, currently in its 99th volume. The same academy publishes Journal of Biosciences (www.ias.ac.in/jbiosci/index.html), another very good journal. Both these journals are free-to-access. In addition, some more subject specific journals are also available online and free-to-access for example Indian Journal of Biotechnology (www.niscair.res.in/sciencecommunication/ResearchJournals/.../ijbto.asp), Indian Journal of Pure and Applied Physics (<http://www.niscair.res.in/sciencecommunication/ResearchJournals/rejour/ijpap/ijpapo.asp>), Indian Journal of Chemistry (<http://www.niscair.res.in/sciencecommunication/ResearchJournals/rejour/IJCB/ijcbo.asp>).

Further, some of the established journals for example Indian Journal of Medical Research, available on <http://icmr.nic.in/ijmr/ijmr.htm>, a Journal with highest Impact Factor amongst all Indian Journals, have started special section dedicated to students' articles and being named as Student IJMR. All these kind of web-based resources should be explored by the students.

Some websites can even help the students not only in providing the information but to use their online software to carry on their research projects. For example Indian Council of Agricultural Research Complex, Goa provides free online software for statistical analyses of the data generated by the students for their projects.

Students may also know the worlds best scientific publishers by exploring their websites, which includes Elsevier Publishing (www.elsevier.com), Springer (www.springerlink.com), Taylor and Francis(www.taylorandfrancis.com), Blackwell Publishing (www3.interscience.wiley.com). All these publishers are best known for their world class journals and books. The knowledge of all these websites has become more important because these days all these publishers allow the authors to submit their manuscripts online only using various software and websites for example Editorial-Manager™ (www.editorialmanager.com) by Elsevier.

We can easily conclude from all these points that the students and research scholars should immediately start up the exploration of web-based information and be acquainted to a whole new world of such web-based resources. I am sure this will definitely help them to get the necessary updates from different scientific fields as well as will help them in their future career opportunities.
